

WIN Card Reimbursement Program — Encouraging Alberta's Youth Hunters

All first-time hunters in Alberta are required by law to complete the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Course in order to become eligible to purchase a hunting license or a Wildlife Identification Number (WIN) Card for hunting purposes.

In an effort to inspire Alberta's youth to get outdoors, Alberta Sustainable Resource Development's objective was to "give every kid that graduates from a Hunter Education class a free WIN card."

Based on this objective, the Alberta Conservation Association (ACA), the Alberta Sustainable Resource Development (SRD), and the Alberta Hunter Education Instructors' Association (AHEIA), and Hunting For Tomorrow (HFT) implemented a joint initiative in August 2009, in which all youth (between the ages of 11 and 17) will receive a reimbursement certificate for a WIN card after taking the Alberta Conservation and Hunter Education Course.

ACA sends a cheque for \$8.40 to any youth who submits the form to cover the cost of their first WIN card. In 2009, approximately 748 kits were sent out to Alberta youth Hunter Education graduates.

It is the hope of the partners ACA, AHEIA, HFT, and SRD that this initiative will encourage Alberta's youth to seek involvement in outdoor activities.
