Manages fish and wildlife species based on the best available science and integrated decision-making processes that generate new information for informed, future decision-making. The sound stewardship of fish and wildlife resources facilitates consumptive (fishing and hunting) and non-consumptive recreational opportunities compatible with healthy, diverse fish and wildlife populations.
